



Dear Future Hawk,

Happy New Year from the River Hill Bands! My name is Mr. Blackman and I have been the proud Band Director at RHHS for the last 15 of my 33 total years teaching in Howard County. I wanted to reach out and let you know how excited I am to welcome you to River Hill. It is time to get started with registration for Band, so here is some information that you'll need.

At this point, the most important thing is to get Band on your schedule for next year. It's easy - just register for course #MU-400-1 - Concert Band (if you play a wind instrument) or #MU-480-1 - percussion Ensemble (if you play percussion). More info (including placement audition procedures) can be found later in this packet, so please read on. Another great way to learn about the RHHS Band Program is to check out at informational video that I posted on YouTube (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=SPcJlqcPdbw>). Some of it is slightly outdated, but it includes a typical year's schedule, along with clips of some of our most awesome performances.

Speaking of performances, I would also invite you to check out any of the concert recordings that I have posted online. Just search for "River Hill High School Band" on YouTube. If you like what you hear, please leave us a comment!

You've probably heard this before, but I agree with your other Band Directors about the importance of private instruction. There is no better investment you can make in your music education than private lessons, because spending an hour a week with a true expert on your instrument is the absolute best way to improve your playing. If you are ready to start lessons, please let me know, and I will help you find a teacher whose approach coordinates best with what you'll be doing at River Hill.

I'd like to share a statement made by one of my students who wanted to let you know how much Band means to her: "I am glad that I played in the RHHS band for all four years because it turned out to be so much more than what I expected. Not only did I improve immensely, but I also made unexpected and amazing friends through the bond of music. It's awesome to have that one steady class throughout high school that you can always count on." And you know what? It means that much to ME, too. Welcome to the RHHS Band Family - we are going to do amazing things together!

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

please read on.....

Q: I'm really busy. Should I continue to play my instrument?

A: ABSOLUTELY. Your life will be happier with music in it (truly!), and kids who plan to "just take a year off," ALMOST NEVER RETURN (so don't do that). Furthermore, colleges REALLY like to see that you have studied music because they know that it makes you a very hard worker and a strong thinker and problem-solver. Everyone at River Hill is busy, and still almost every Band student plays for all four years of high school before going on to colleges like Harvard and M. I.T.! Need to see a sample schedule with four years of Band in it? Just let me know and I will send it to you!

Q: I hear that the River Hill Bands have done some traveling. Is that true?

A: Oh yes it is! We have performed in some truly awesome places, including Nashville, New York City, Indianapolis, and DisneyWorld! This year we are returning to Florida!

Q: Are there many opportunities for individual growth in the Band program?

A: Yes there are. We always get a lot of kids participating in All-State auditions, Solo/Ensemble Festival, and Tri-M Music Honor Society. There are leadership opportunities within the ensembles (drum major, student leader, etc.), and also some great music "elective" classes like piano, guitar, music technology, and music theory. You even get G/T credit once you place into the Wind Ensemble!

Q: How can I hear the River Hill Bands?

A: Well, the best way is to come out and hear us live! All of our concerts are free. If you can't wait until concert time, check us out on YouTube by searching for:

RHHS Bands audition information

First, and most importantly, this is a non-stress situation. I just need to get you placed in the appropriate class so that you are challenged at the right level. Here we go.....

Step 1

Think about what you'd like to play for me at your placement audition. It can ANYTHING - something that you played in Band, something that you've learned for your private teacher...whatever demonstrates your strengths as a player. If you would like to be considered for placement in our Wind Ensemble, there will be some specific music that you need to learn, and it will be available by January 1st. Just go to the RHHS Band Booster website at <https://rhhsband.wixsite.com/boosters/future-hawks>. Click the audition music icon, select the appropriate page for your instrument, and take a look. If it appears to be something you can learn, great - get started! If not - no worries. Just play something else!

Step 2

Sign up for an audition time. The link will be on the same page as the audition music link. Auditions will take place in the RHHS Band Room (Room 206) on Thursday, February 15th and Saturday, February 17th. If you can not make it on either of those days, please let me know and we will figure something else out. My email address is Michael.Blackman@HCPSS.org.

Step 3

On audition day, please feel free to arrive as early as you like. You will be greeted by some of my current Band members and then you can warm-up. *Be sure to bring a parent with you*, because we will need him/her to share some info with our Boosters while you are with my students and me.

And that's it! I look forward to seeing you. Please be sure to let me know if you need anything before I see you in February.
